Junior League of the Oranges and Short Hills Restocks the Orange School District Nurses' Pantries

Millburn, NJ - In collaboration with 28 Days Project and Dun & Bradstreet, the Junior League of the Oranges and Short Hills (JLOSH) restocked the nurses' pantries of the Orange School District with nearly 2,900 items of non-medical wellness essentials.

The Nurses' Pantry Program within the Orange School District is a vital resource for children in need. The pantries provide basic items and hygiene products to students who may not otherwise have access to them. This year, JLOSH was delighted to once again support the District by restocking its pantries with feminine hygiene products, deodorant, toothbrushes and toothpaste. To support its efforts, JLOSH collaborated with its community partner, Dun & Bradstreet, which collected items during its *Do Good Week* in July. Additionally, 28 Days Project, a local nonprofit that provides feminine products to women in need generously donated 30 boxes, or 750 pads, to the District.

Together with its community partners, JLOSH donated over 2,900 individual items, including 1,488 feminine hygiene products, 400 toothbrushes, 333 tubes of toothpaste, 267 stick of deodorant, 150 packs of tissues and many other non-medical miscellaneous items.

“We are thrilled to once again partner with the Orange School District to ensure students have access to the basic items supplied by the nurses' pantries,” said Larisa Holderied, President-Elect of the Junior League of the Oranges & Short Hills. “The City of Orange Township is a key area of our service and we are always looking for opportunities to deepen our impact and better support students, along with their families, living in Orange.”
